YOUR WORKSHOP

A KS3 visit where learners will plan and complete their own fieldwork to identify just how "Bee-friendly" our environment is.

Learners will discover how we classify a habitat before designing and undertaking a survey of the physical geography of the different areas of Chester House. On returning to the classroom they will share their results and learn how to interpret and represent their data to report on their findings and draw conclusions.

This is an all-weather workshop so we recommend learners bring/wear outdoor clothing and footwear.

CURRICULUM LINKS

- human geography relating to: population and urbanisation; international development; economic activity in the primary, secondary, tertiary and quaternary sectors; and the use of natural resources
- understand how human and physical processes interact to influence, and change landscapes, environments and the climate; and how human activity relies on effective functioning of natural systems
- use fieldwork in contrasting locations to collect, analyse and draw conclusions from geographical data, using multiple sources of increasingly complex information
