YOUR WORKSHOP

Learners will explore the different habitats that can be found at Chester House. During the classroom activity, we will explore the features that make a good habitat before going into the landscape on a bug hunt. Learners will:

- Identify different habitats and their features
- Find and identify different species of insects
- Discuss and identify the features of a good habitat.
